Mr. Beauchamp called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

REVENUE ANTICIPATION LOAN BIDS

Mr. Pennell reported on the three bids received as follows:

Bank of Lancaster	5.3%
First Virginia Bank	5.34%
Northern Neck State Bank	5.5%

Motion was made by Mr. Simmons to accept the bid received from the Bank of Lancaster and to adopt the following resolution:

VSH 600

Motion was made by Mr. Conaway to adopt the following resolution expressing the boards concern, to be sent to VDOT, our senators and legislative representatives:

WHEREAS, during Hurricane Floyd in September 1999, the 17± inches of rain which fell in Lancaster County, Virginia caused Mohone's Run to carry an enormous amount of storm water; and

WHEREAS, this volume of storm water caused the bridge over Mohone's Run to be completely washed out; and

WHEREAS, Virginia State Highway 600 through Lancaster County is an important thoroughfare that enables Lancaster's citizens to access important businesses and services as well as provide for the timely response of emergency services to a large area of Lancaster County; and

WHEREAS, the alternative to transversing Virginia State Highway 600 is a detour that adds valuable time to the response of emergency services as well as creates a serious inconvenience to many Lancaster County residents living in the northwest quadrant of the County; and

WHEREAS, the Lancaster County Board of Supervisors has previously communicated the importance of restoring motor vehicle transportation over Virginia State Highway 600 to the Virginia Department of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, as of the date of this resolution, the bridge over Mohone's Run has not been repaired although nearly one year has passed; and

WHEREAS, plans to repair this bridge will not be complete until the Spring of 2001 or longer depending upon the severity of the weather during of Winter of 2000/2001; and

WHEREAS, the Citizens and Board of Supervisors of Lancaster County are frustrated at the inordinate amount of time it is taking to repair this small bridge in Lancaster County; and

WHEREAS, it seems that the Virginia Department of Transportation has not placed an appropriate priority on the repair of this significant thoroughfare in Lancaster County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Lancaster County Board of Supervisors, that the Virginia Department of Transportation be again informed of the need to reconstruct the bridge over Mohone's Run in a timely manner; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Secretary of Transportation of the Commonwealth of Virginia is asked to take whatever action is necessary to facilitate the early reconstruction of the bridge over Mohone's Run and to utilize her good offices to require that the staff of the Virginia Department of Transportation place the highest

priority on the repair of this bridge following an unreasonable delay in restoring travel over Virginia State Highway 600.

VOTE: 3 – 0 Aye.

NORTHUMBERLAND REZONING

There followed a discussion of the notice from Northumberland County regarding the rezoning for residential units at the site of the former Rappahannock Oyster Company.

The board agreed by consensus to take no action on this matter.
